

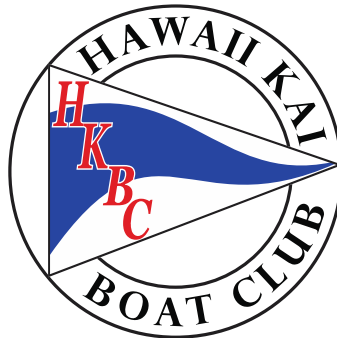

1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing 2021-2024*
- 1.2 US SAILING prescriptions will apply. Class rules will apply.
- 1.3 If there is a conflict between languages the English text will take precedence.
- 1.4 RRS Appendix P will apply. In case of conflict between the NOR and the SI, the SI shall prevail

2 ADVERTISING

- 2.1 Competitor advertising will be restricted as follows: The organising authority reserves the right to refuse advertising by a boat or competitor when it is in conflict with an event sponsor or government regulations.
Competitor Advertising will not be restricted, but may not added as an appendage to the sailor or vessel.
The sails do not need to carry class insignias applied by the licensed manufacturer..
- 2.2 Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the organizing authority.

3 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 3.1 This event is open to all boats by invitation:
All sailors shall be financial members of a yacht club that is affiliated with US Sailing or their MNA.
Divisions may race as one fleet or in groups depending upon entry numbers.
TIME LIMIT: The time limit for the race will be 3 and a half hours from the start
WIND LIMIT: Minimum 8 knots and maximum 18 knots required to hold the race
All competitors must be familiar with and adhere to the “Race Safety Plan” *Attachment #4*
- 3.2 Eligible boats may enter by completing registration online through the Events tab found at HawaiiKaiBoatClub.com
- 3.3 Online registration closes at 11:59 PM on ~~January 1~~ **April 9**, 2022.
- 3.4 **NO date-of or on-site Registration will be accepted.**
- 3.5 \$50 Early Registration ends 11:59 PM ~~December 26~~, **April 3**, 2021 will calculate toward # of class boats competing to guarantee class boat prizes.
- 3.6 \$65 Late Registration is open from ~~December 27 to January 1~~ **April 4 to April 9** at 11:59 PM will not guarantee class boat number of entries for calculation of presented awards.

4 CLASSIFICATION

- 4.1 Boats will be classified by one design: O’pen Skiff, 29er, Waszp, iQFoil, Lazer, 420, FJ, etc when at least 5 boats of the design class are registered by 11:59 PM December 26, 2021.
- 4.2 Boats without 5 entries in their one design class will be classified by hull design (skiff, displacement, foil, canoe, catamaran, single-handed, double-handed, etc) and will be grouped to qualify for awards by hull design.

5 FEES

- 5.1 Required fees are as follows:
Early Registration before 11:59 PM, ~~December 26~~ **April 3**: \$50.00 USD **per competitor** for all classes.
Late Registration to ~~January 1~~, **April 9, 2022** at 11:59 PM: \$65.00 USD **per competitor** for all classes.
For safety of all competitors, NO date-of or on-site registration will be allowed.

6 QUALIFYING RACE or COACH APPROVAL

6.1 Sailors under the age of 18 must have their coach’s approval or qualify to race an O’pen Skiff using their ranked place finish at the HKBC Winter Clinic & Regatta from December 28-30.

6.2 For the safety of competitors: The Race Director or HKBC Sailing Director may determine the conditions to advanced for some sailors and reserves the right to disallow participation based on their skill level or a vessel’s lack of seaworthiness. All fees will be refunded, and the sailor may be invited to watch the race from a spectator boat.

8 MEASUREMENTS

A boat or equipment may be inspected at any time for compliance with the Class Rules, Notice of Race or Sailing Instructions.

9 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The sailing instructions will be posted by 8:30 AM, January 2, on the event website and sent out to Mobile # that is texted at Check-in.

10 VENUE

10.1 Attachment #1 shows the location of the Start Area

10.2 Attachment #2 and #3 shows the location of the racing areas.

11 THE COURSES

START: 1 Start. The starting line will be between the red, horned Forward WIP buoy and the Race Committee Boat.

THE FINISH: a line between Magic Island Point and the Red Channel Marker.

12 PENALTY SYSTEM

12.1 For the All classes rule 44.1 is changed so that the Two-Turns Penalty is replaced by the One-Turn Penalty.

12.2 Protests will be heard only in the case of a collision resulting in serious injury or damage, modifying rule 60.

12.3 Good seamanship and common sense are the order of the day.

13 SCORING

13.1 The Low Point scoring system of RRS Appendix A will apply.

A boat starting later than 10 minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start. This changes RRS A4 and A5.

14 SUPPORT BOATS

All support boats shall register with the OA and shall conspicuously display an identifying flag which will be provided at registration and follow the requirements for support boats including providing assistance if requested by the Race Officer.

All support boats shall check in between 7:00 AM and 8:00 AM via TEXT MESSAGE to **808-753-9694 and 808-348-8800** with the following:

Support boats are requested to monitor VHF channel 68 and their registered mobile phone for safety information from the race committee.

Support boats shall remain at least 50m outside the course area unless providing safety assistance to a competitor

Support Boats must be familiar with the safety Plan *Attachment #4*

Support Boats must report aiding and assisting in any form to any vessels to the Race Committee.

15 BERTHING

Boats shall be kept in their assigned places while they are in the boat park

LOAD AT ALAWAI BOAT RAMP/ RETURN TO HKBC:

All owner boats must bring their own trailers/trucks to retrieve their boats

16 MEDIA RIGHTS

In participating in this event, a competitor or their guardian automatically grants to the organising authority and the sponsors of the event, the right in perpetuity, to make, use and show, from time to time and at their discretion, any motion pictures, still pictures and live, taped or film television and other reproductions of him/her during the period of the competition for the said event in which the competitor participates and in all material related to the said event without compensation.

17 COMMUNICATION

Except in an emergency, a Registered Competing boat shall neither make or receive radio or phone transmissions from 9:27 AM, or the time at which the First Warning Signal has been made. Communications may be made if available to all boats or directly to and from the Race Committee if instructed by the Race Committee to respond.

Support boats are requested to monitor VHF channel 71 for safety information from the race committee.

18 PRIZES

One award for the first boat in class with more than 5 entries.

Two awards for classes with 6 entries

Three awards for classes with 7 or more entries
Overall award for 1st vessel to cross the finish line
One Award for each boat division not with fewer than 5 boats in a one design class

No competitor will receive 2 awards (IE Top Lazer will not receive duplicate top single-handed skiff) except for the overall perpetual trophy.

Other prizes may be awarded as determined by the Organizing Authority.

19 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk and responsibility. See rule RRS 4, Decision to Race. The Organising Authority, the Hawaii Kai Boat Club and any other organisation connected with the event, their officials, employees, agents and any sponsors, will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta or as a consequence of their participation in any way in the race.

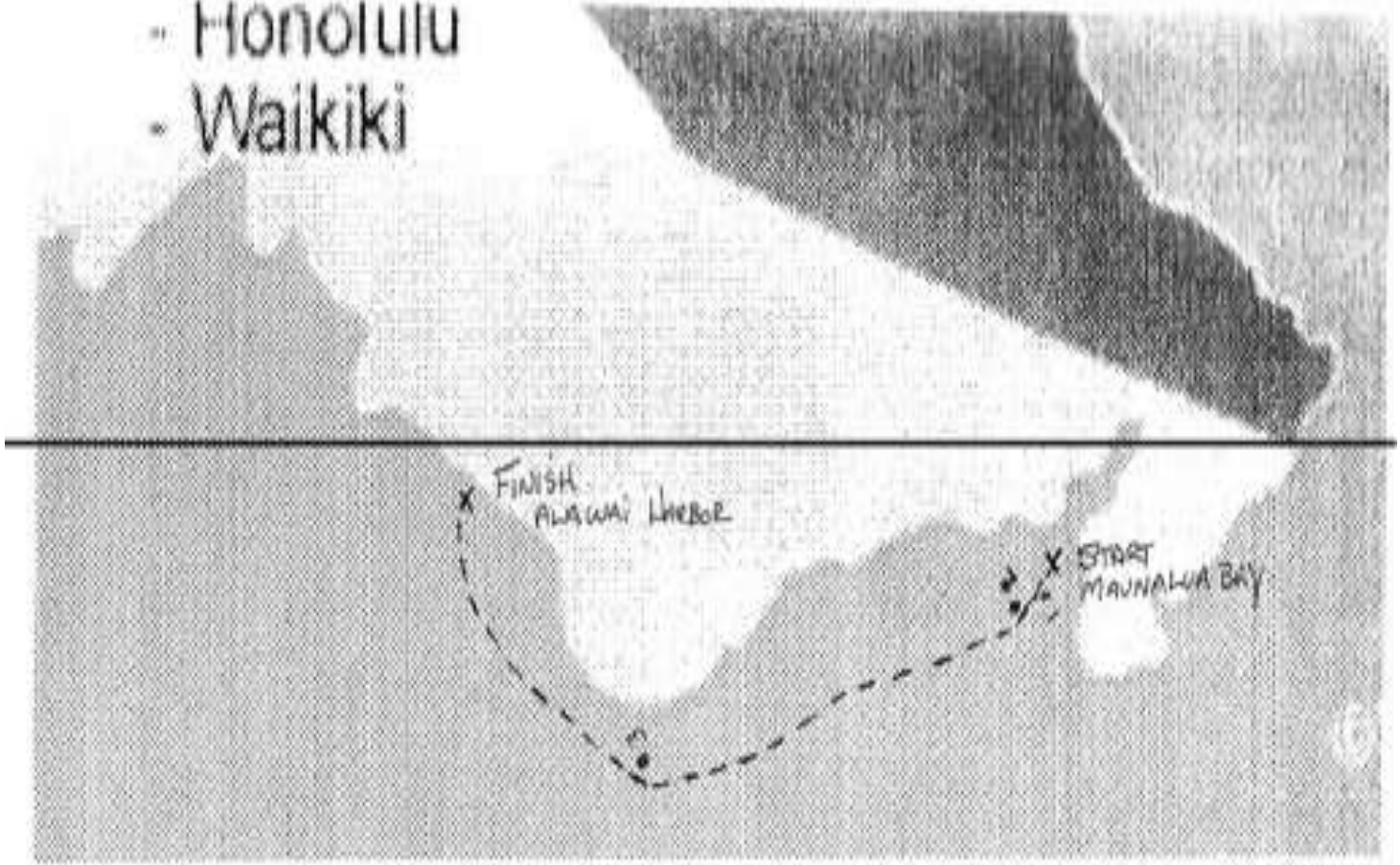

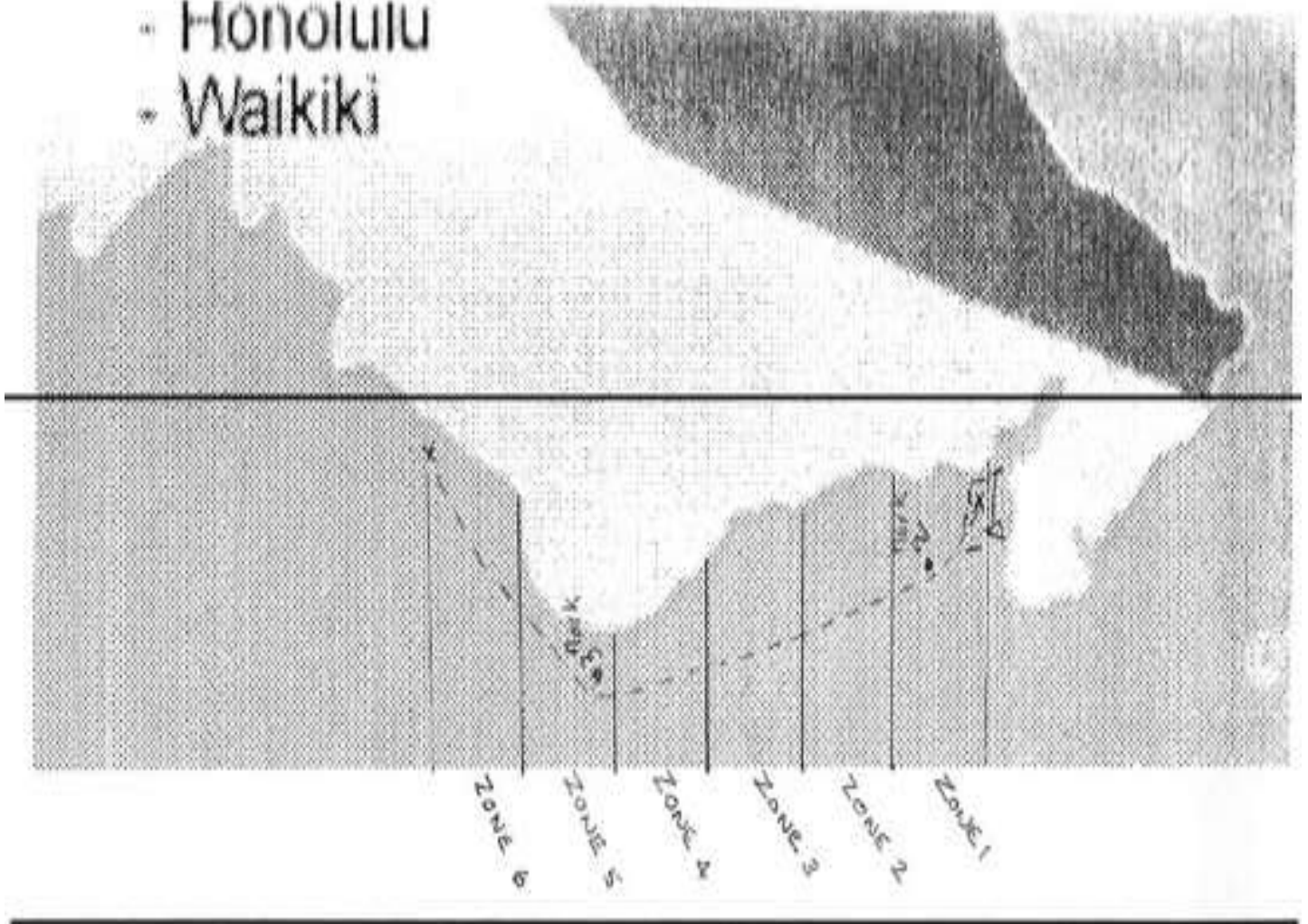
Attachment 2 – Race route

Race SAFETY PLAN:

A total of six (6) “safety zone” Vessels.

One safety vessel per zone

Safety vessels will be deployed prior to the start

Safety vessels will all follow the last vessel to the finish

Additionally to the safety vessels approximately 2 to 3 inflatable escort RIB will follow the fleet down the entire course

All safety vessels and escort RIBs must have VHF radio and registered mobile phones.

All safety vessels monitor VHF channel 68.

Substitution of safety vessels, RIBs, Skippers, & Crew may be subject to change before 8:30 AM January 2

In the event that a sailor needs assistance from one or any of the safety zone vessels or escort RIBs; the skipper from that safety vessel or escort RIB must report the assistance to the Race Committee via Channel VHF 68 or Mobile numbers 808-753-9694 and 808-348-8800.

All sailors must wear USCG approved Personal Floatation Devices (PFDs) during the entire regatta.

All sailors must carry a mobile phone on their person during the entire regatta.

All sailors must follow the rules of racing

All sailors must sign the online waiver during registration.

Registration will not be active until payment is made in full.

The Race Director reserves the right to limit the number of entries during the Late Registration period.

For the safety of all competitors, the Race Director reserves the right to cancel entries whom are deemed to not have adequate sailing experience or a sea worthy vessel. Cancelled registrations will be fully refunded.

Safety boat vessels and safety escort RIB requirements:

-All Safety zone vessels and escort RIB must be checked in by Text message before the start of the race

-Safety zone vessels must have at least one spotter in addition to captain

-All Safety Boat skippers will have their HI State Safety Certification & boats will have current registration.
